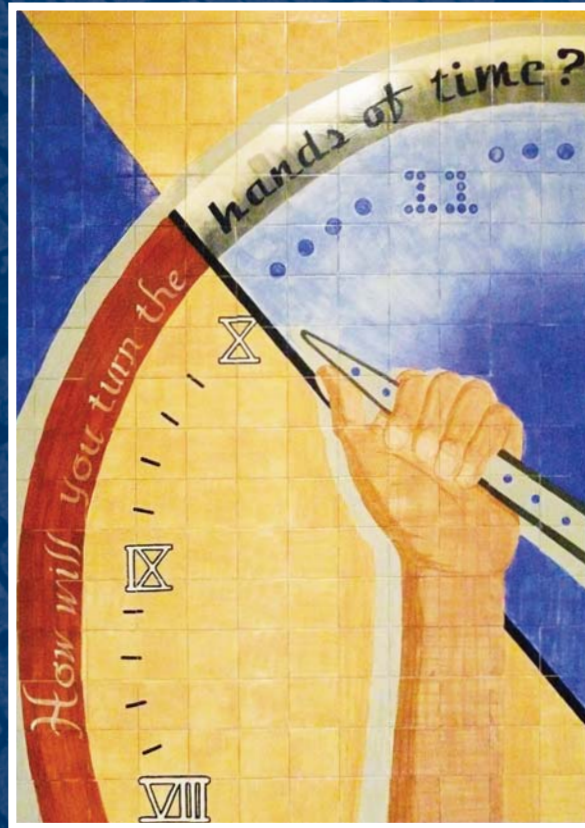

This Is Your Time!

The message of this year's Annual Fund, *This Is Your Time!* has almost taken on a life of its own. It has become the theme that Lehman faculty, staff, students, alumni, and friends are embracing as we focus on the vocations God has given us through this high school.

The theme of this Annual Report stems from a song written by Michael W. Smith by the same title. Smith released *This Is Your Time* in 1999, shortly after the Columbine Massacre. It was written in reference to a student by the name of Cassie Bernall who was said to have been gunned down by one of the assailants because she answered 'yes' to whether she believed in God. The lyrics to the refrain are what inspired our theme.

*This is your time, this is your dance, live every moment, leave nothing to chance.
Swim in the sea, drink of the deep, embrace the mystery of all you can be. This is your time!*

This is our time and Lehman Catholic High School is where we've been given the opportunity to choreograph our dance. Regardless of our relationship to this community, God has called us to be part of it. Are we living every moment of this unique opportunity? Are we fulfilling God's call to serve Lehman and its constituents with our time, talent and treasure?

Some of us are. This report recognizes all of those who contributed some form of their treasure during the past fiscal year (July 1, 2010-June 30, 2011). It also provides a list of those who made contributions during the fiscal year not only to the Annual Fund, but also to the Secure the Future Campaign. We take this opportunity to express appreciation for all your gifts. Lehman Catholic is sustained through your efforts and we, as a community, are grateful for your "yes" to God's call for support.

This year has been as difficult as any due to our state and country's continued economic woes, the continued uncertainty of the stock market, high unemployment and the anxiety over government policy. Fundraising remains difficult. Still, our constituents were generous, as this report indicates. We thank all of our family who continue their support.

The next several years provide great opportunity for Lehman Catholic. We must choose to live every moment, leaving nothing to chance. It is important that we hear and follow God's call to set out into the sea. I pray that this message of renewal finds each of you well and prepared to answer God's urge to recall, reinvent, and reinvigorate Lehman Catholic High School which was left to us by those who gave from their need, not their surplus. I am sure the Lord has assigned them the same status as the "poor widow" from the Gospel of Luke. Her gift was looked upon as having given "more than the rest" because she gave "from her poverty." I pray we will have the courage to do the same.

Remember, Lehman Catholic is not just a school. It is how we evangelize our children. It is how we teach them to evangelize others. It is how we grow the Catholic faith for future generations. When we don't evangelize our children and raise them in the faith, we don't just lose our children. We lose generation after generation after generation. This is evident in our world today.

Goals of the 2011-2012 Annual Fund Campaign

We are setting our compass for this year's Annual Fund and the goals we have chosen. We choose to look to the future and accept God's call to trust that He will "open wide the floodgates of heaven, pouring down blessing without measure." (Mal 3:10) We need to be wise stewards of the gifts God has provided, all while trusting that He will provide for the needs of Lehman Catholic High School and her community. Our goal - \$400,000 - reflects the needs of the school that are not met through revenues derived from student tuition or other fundraising efforts. The following are our goals for the 2011-2012 Annual Fund as well as our accomplishments from last year.

Scholarships/Tuition Assistance

Two Lehman Families and the Alumni Association blazed the path toward a new vision for funding an education at Lehman Catholic High School. The Ronald S. Francis Family continued their four year tradition of awarding a \$1000 scholarship to a graduate of Holy Angels Catholic School, Ron's alma mater. This year, the family also extended their generosity and support for Lehman and its students by awarding two additional \$500 scholarships. The Francis children chose a Lehman Scholarship to honor their parents' dedication to Catholic Education.

Frank and Julie (Raterman) Gilardi (LCHS '76) also recognize scholarships as a road to support Lehman while building a culture of giving for the future. Frank and Julie have begun the process of endowing a set of scholarships that will be awarded each year to Lehman students. This year, five students received \$1000 scholarships to offset the cost of their tuition here at Lehman. The scholarships will be awarded each year and will range from \$1000-\$2500 depending on the decision of the scholarship committee.

This same altruistic spirit has been inspired by the Lehman Catholic Alumni Association. The first Lehman Catholic High School Alumni Association Scholarships were presented this past year. Although the goal of the organization isn't to be a fundraising arm of the school, the Alumni Association believes it can serve its core mission of bringing the constituents of Lehman together through supporting scholarships for students. Three \$750 scholarships were presented to students of Holy Angels and Piqua Catholic schools.

These scholarships are an ingenuitive way for alumni, parents, grandparents and supporters of Lehman Catholic to provide for the needs of Lehman and her students. Just as important, this type of philanthropy helps to encourage a culture of giving that will perpetuate

itself for generations. The need for tuition assistance is tremendous, as is evidenced by the \$371,000 allotted by the Board of Limited Jurisdiction to families this year. Using this financial support to connect investors with students is a way to bolster a culture of giving. This is a culture which already exists among our generous supporters, but will help a new generation realize the special gift we have in people who choose to invest in the future of students formed in the Catholic faith.

Enrollment

Many in our Lehman community desire to increase enrollment in our school. We have first-class academics, passionately teach the Catholic faith and have championship sports teams as well as a great offering of extracurricular activities. This year we are refocusing our vision. What does it mean to be a Catholic high school?

What is our mission? Simply put, we can refer to our mission statement. Lehman Catholic educates the whole person – body, mind and soul – for the glory of God and service to others. Lehman Catholic is committed to this, but are we reaching all of the young people we can?

Our enrollment stands this year at 210 students. We have the capacity to educate 400 students according to past studies. This will be our ten year goal – a school which reaches capacity in our efforts to fulfill the Gospel command of Jesus, "Go, make disciples of all nations."

In a recent visioning meeting, the Superintendent of Catholic Schools, Dr. Jim Rigg, spoke of three mandates from the Church concerning Catholic education. First is to teach the faith of the Catholic Church. Second is to provide academics that are above or comparable to the surrounding schools. Last (not least of all) is to provide an education that is affordable for any family who wishes for their child to receive a Catholic education.

Evangelization must be our number one goal as a Catholic school. The term evangelization will be our new term for enrollment. Our world, country and community need the Lehman family to step forward and do what we

were created to do. We need to fulfill our vocation – our calling from God. We must provide all of our children with a Catholic education which allows them to fulfill their vocation to bring Christ to a world in need. To make disciples of all nations, we must start at Lehman. We are the ones who will provide for the education of those who will shape our future. *This is our time!* Our children are the future of the Catholic faith. We must invest our very best in them. As Jesus said, “For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be.” (Lk 12:34) Let’s place our hearts with our children by fulfilling the challenge of funding a Lehman Catholic education for all children. A Lehman Catholic education may never be free, but it can be affordable for all if we put aside our limits and challenge ourselves to greater goals.

Debt Elimination

As this Annual Report is being written, President Mike Barhorst is visiting donors from Florida to Ohio with the goal of eliminating the remainder of the school’s debt. Last fiscal year, a debt elimination campaign was undertaken to take advantage of the Archbishop’s offer to forgive \$250,000 of the school’s nearly \$1,000,000 debt.

Through a \$50,000 matching grant received from the Mathile Family Foundation and the generosity of twenty donors, Lehman Catholic High School is in reach of becoming debt free. The remaining debt of \$150,000, in the form of a low-interest loan from the Unity Savings Bank, is the goal to be raised from this effort. Retirement of the debt will save the school approximately \$50,000 a year in interest savings alone.

Technology

New computers were purchased for the computer and science labs with the major grant received from the Niels and Ruth Lundgard Foundation, but more updating of technology needs to take place. As all of us experience with our own technology, whether it be computers, SMART phones, tablets, etc, keeping up with the types of tools used today can be extremely difficult. You can be assured when Lehman spends resources on technology, it is not spent recklessly on the newest and greatest. We purchase equipment that supports our student and faculty needs while being as prudent with resources as possible. It is time to update several key needs. Our faculty has waited patiently and made great sacrifices to save the school from having to upgrade the computers used in the classroom. It has reached a critical time now when new software updates are more than many of our faculty computers can handle. It is reaching a critical point where Lehman will need to upgrade these computers to operate future software updates.

The Lehman administration has been prudent in avoiding trendy technology such as laptops and tablets for our students, which some studies have shown detract from learning rather than enhance it. The students and faculty can benefit from upgrades that will allow more interactive learning to take place in the classroom.

These needs are real and will rely on the support of our generous Lehman family. Lehman leads the way in high academic standards. Please consider helping us provide our students and faculty with up-to-date technology that will allow Lehman to continue this tradition.

Putting It All Together

Your gifts have allowed Lehman Catholic High School to achieve its past goals. We ask you to join us again or possibly for the first time. You are the Lehman family and we need your support.

I ask you, personally, to join me as if we were setting off on a new adventure. Setting out into the unknown as our parents, grandparents and great-grandparents did when they built schools and parishes so that we might one day take the torch they lit and pass the faith on to the next generation.

Will we pass a torch that is nearly burnt out or will we pass on a torch that is as bright as a shining city on a hill? I know which one I will choose and even though my time as a Lehman Cavalier has been short, I am confident I know which torch you will choose too. Let us commit today to offering our lives as did the servant who was given five talents and returned ten to his Lord. Our gift is Lehman Catholic High School and we have been asked by our Lord to be good and faithful servants.

When our time is finished here, let us be prepared to respond to God with these words. “You gave us many treasures in life. We used them to bless others with the gift of a Catholic education. You gave us a school with 210 students. We return it to you with 400. You blessed us in deed with updated facilities and we were indebted to you. We paid our obligations. Our school was a top academic institution. We invested and made it better so our children would be prepared to pass the Catholic faith on to the next generation.” I can hear the Lord responding, “Well done, good and faithful servants. Enter into my Kingdom for you have been faithful in small matters, now, I will give you great responsibilities.” And we will enter into the Father’s joy – but, not until our work here is through.

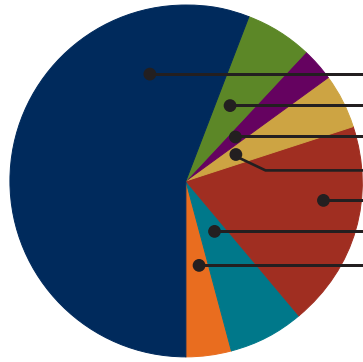

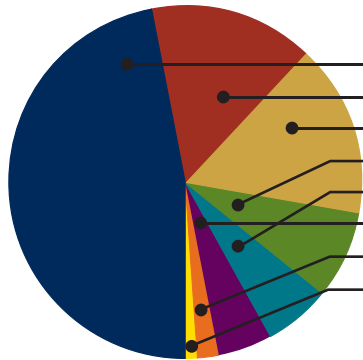

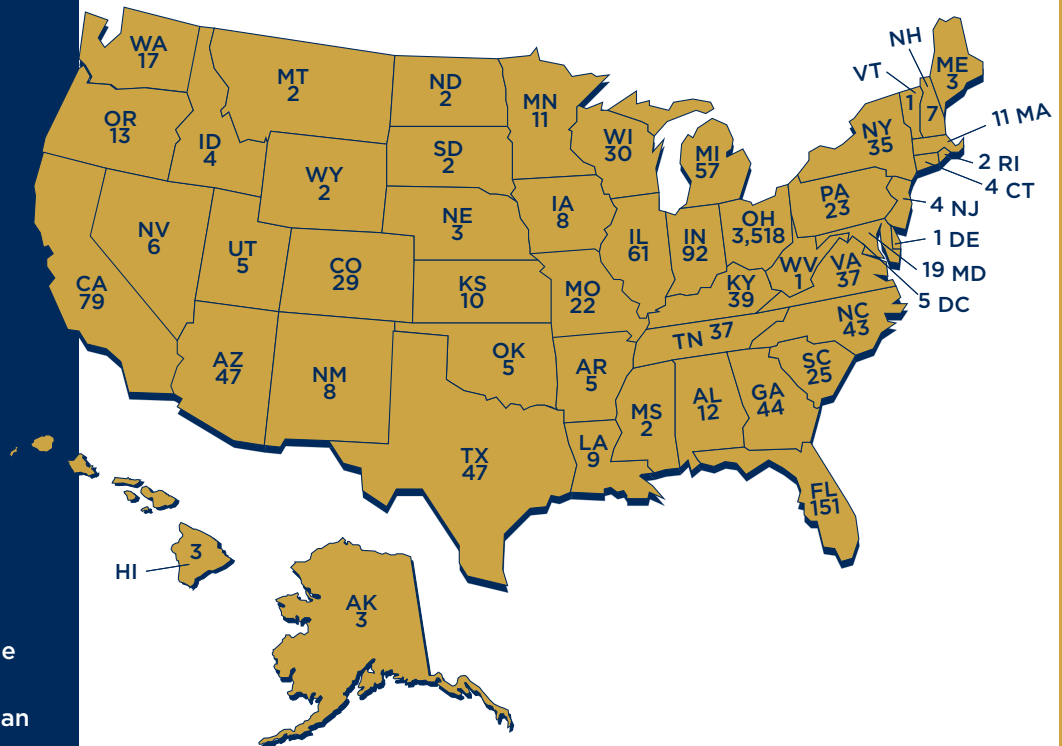
